Charleston High School had a Wonderful record, winning eight of her nine games and playing a 0-0 tie with Wheeling. Charleston scored 397 points, never had her goal line crossed and in fact had no eleven inside her twenty yard line. Wheeling won nine games, lost one and tied one. Charleston however played seven state games to only five for Wheeling and defeated both Parkersburg and Huntington, two leaders whereas Wheeling's main West Virginia victories were over Morgantown and Buckhannon, which elevens stood relative low in the state rankings.
